Every Day Counts at Mountain Creek

Upcoming Social Media Age Restrictions

From 10 December, children under 16 won't be allowed to create or keep their existing social media accounts under new Australian laws. This isn't a ban—it's a delay to give young people more time to build safe, healthy digital habits, enhance online safety and reduce exposure to online harm for young people.

Please note, we will continue to use Facebook to share school updates and announcements as usual.

The eSafety Commissioner is encouraging parents and carers to start conversations with their children now and explore safe alternatives for staying connected. If your child has a social media account, remind them to download any photos or videos they want to keep before the 10th of December.




RAFE WINS GOLD!


BOOK CLUB ISSUE 8 OUT NOW!

Each fortnight our school focuses on a different expectation. These expectations are explicitly taught and then reinforced through the awarding of Creeker Credits.


Our focus for the next fortnight from our Positive Behaviour for Learning Matrix is:

"Persist with Learning Tasks"

This expectation focuses on learning to be resilient and persistent when facing challenges and the belief that if they keep trying they can achieve success.

What can you do at home to support this focus?

- Talk to your kids about failures in your own life ("I messed this up today but...) and how you achieved something in the end.
- Let the kids see you working on things and sometimes getting it wrong but trying again.
- Show them how to positively react to a failure.
- Notice and praise the persistence and resilience shown in your child completing something, not always just the successful outcome.
